- Mark Sherman at the October meeting and 2 workshops (Remarkable Faux Applique and Remarkable Machine Trapunto).

Jean Dyer announced the Fall Retreat will be August 7-9 at Clifty Falls State Park in Madison, IN.

Margaret Duke--For National Quilting Day, March 21, the charity group will be hosting a quilting demonstration at the Eiteljorg Museum in conjunction with the Quilts Exhibit: Uncovering Women's Stories. There will be a presentation at 1 PM by Dr. Carolyn Mazloomi. Also, Dallas Reed will have a charity workday on March 21 at the Irvington United Methodist Church from 9-3 with a pitch-in lunch. The next monthly charity workday will be the 3rd Thursday in February.

Christine Hurley—Six quilt tops for Quilts of Valor (QOV) were completed at the National QOV Sew Day; these will be shown at the 2021 QGI Quilt Show. Also, two women were awarded quilts of valor at the event. Christine thanked everyone who participated in the event. New QOV groups are starting in Noblesville and in Marion. If you donate any patriotic Floating Ohio Star blocks throughout the year, put your name on them and Chris will draw a winner in December for a prize.

Deb Eberly announced an ongoing Improvisational Quilt Show in Springfield, OH with 50 international large quilts that continues through March 29. Nancy Crow will be speaking at this show on March 15.

Lynn Thomas reminded members to renew their 2020 QGI dues. Starting in March, the rosters will only be 2020 paid members.

Rebecca Connell collected 19 joey pouches that will be shipped to Australia to help save wildlife struggling after the fires.

Diana Stuckey shared the block of the month pattern, a 12.5" churn dash block. Each month will have a different center. Patterns for January and February are available at the QGI website or in the newsletter. For this year's BOM, participants will make blocks January through November that they use themselves to make a quilt top by December. Diana will have a prize raffle for participants each month; show her your completed block to be entered. Shari Harrison won the prize at the February meeting.

The 2019 QGI quilt raffle winner gave the quilt back to the guild. Mary Strinka still had all of the tickets sold for the raffle quilt. So another winning ticket was drawn at the February meeting.

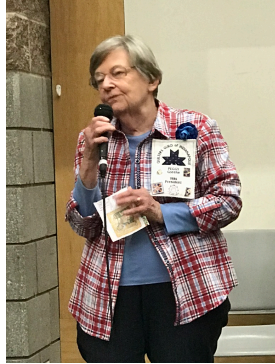
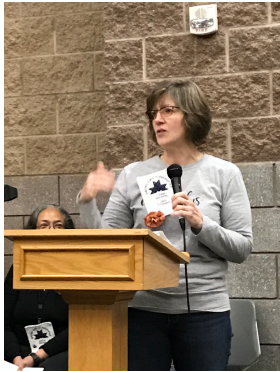
QGI Past Presidents Program:

Mary Ellen Straughn read the first chapter of The First 25 Years of QGI. All past presidents were announced. Fourteen past presidents were present at the meeting and shared something about their time as president of QGI. Several of the past presidents showed quilts including one by Mary Kay Horn that won Best Exhibit in the Women's Building at the IN State Fair. We learned about the Celebrity Quilt made by QGI in 1990, the 2,500 QGI cookbooks

sold in the mid-90s, and the QGI History book created for the first 25 years. Several presidents encouraged members to take a chance and volunteer for QGI.

QGI Programs

March 12th, 2020 - we welcome Johanna Blume, Curator of Western Art, History and Culture at the Eiteljorg Museum. She will talk about the exhibit opening March 7th at the museum and running through August 9th.

What is it: An exhibit that features approximately 30 fascinating quilts by women artists from the early 1800s to the present day in the Western states and reveals captivating experiences and stories of women in the West and Native America. Explore quilts from throughout the American West, including Native America that document people, places and events, and serve as visual records that help us study and understand Western art, history and cultures.

Quilts embody personal stories and symbolize community relationships. Explore the diverse experiences of women in the West and Native America through themes of family and community, ethnic and regional identity and political power and agency.

The guild is participating in this exhibit by having some charity work days there, so people can see live quilters in action!

QGIN NOTES – FEBRUARY 2020

Judy Barmann opened the meeting with the reminder to silence cell phones. She mentioned that February is the month when most birds choose their mate for life, and noted many significant dates in February, from Ground Hog, Presidents', and Valentine's to Mardi Gras and Leap Day. She then led the singing of Happy Birthday to the February birthdays while birthday gifts were distributed.

Anita Harden introduced the speaker. Molly Isenbarger presented "Creating Repeat Designs for Fabric." She spoke about how she got started designing fabric, different types of pattern repeats, digitizing your design with Adobe Illustrator, and having it printed through Spoonflower. She then walked us through an exercise of designing our own pattern repeats, and provided a handout of resources.

A short intermission allowed people people participating in the 5" block exchange to select their squares. The March meeting will be the final square swap.

During announcements, it was mentioned that the August QGIN meeting conflicts with the new dates for the fall retreat, which was moved to August due to an administrative error at Clifty Falls. The following Friday would conflict with a Susan Brubaker Knapp workshop, so if the church is available, the August 7 meeting will be moved to July 31.

Mary Ellen Straughn announced that February's QGI birthday celebration will include remarks by some of the former guild presidents, and cake will be served.

Amy O'Connell reminded everyone that there are still some spaces in upcoming workshops – Kathy McNeil in May and Susan Brubaker Knapp in August. Two Stack n Whack workshops by Mary Strinka have been added on April 4 and June 13, and Mark Sherman will be here in October.

Diana Stuckey is doing the Block of the Month. The January block is Churn Dash, and for the other months, she will be designing variations on the centers of this block. Bring your completed blocks to the meetings to be eligible to win a prize.

Carol Marlin announced that an exhibition of contemporary quilts called Color Improvisations 2 is currently going on at the Springfield (Ohio) Museum of Art. It will be there through March 29, and Nancy Crow will be speaking on March 15. She also mentioned that the Indiana Fiber Group is using a professional photographer; if you are interested in having professional photographs of your quilts for a reasonable price, email her at ceमारlin@sbcglobal.net for details.

Margaret Duke told us she has written an article on Charity Quilts for the February newsletter. For the National Day of Quilting (March 21), Dallas Reed will be holding a Quilt-In and a second one will be held at the Eiteljorg Museum. See the newsletter for details.

Rebecca Connell showed a sample of a bat wrap she made to send to Australia, and will be collecting items at QGI next week if anyone wishes to donate.

Maureen Weflen said Deb Wilmoth is collecting 12.5" tree blocks for the Australia fire victims. There are still 2 spaces remaining in the spring retreat in Shipshewana.

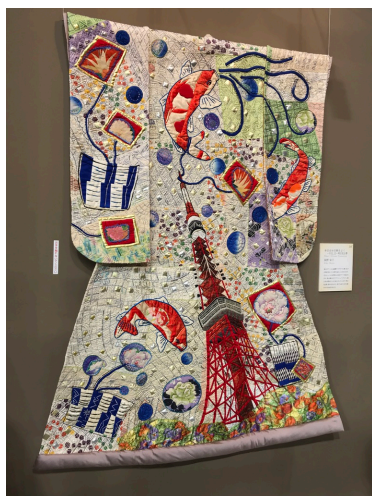
Shari Harrison recognized Bob Yull for the embroidery done on Maureen's MVP jacket and the visitor badges.

This month's tips included several for keeping your foot pedal from "traveling," including placing a rubber band around it, or setting it on an old mousepad or shelf liner. Use the selvages torn from your fabrics to tie up quilts that you are storing rolled. A barbell set on your ruler will keep it from sliding while cutting.

In February the Indiana Pacers announced one of the first activities associated with the February 14, 2021 the NBA All-Star game. Remember when the Indianapolis Colts asked people to hand make blue and white scarfs for volunteers at the Super Bowl in 2012? The total scarfs was over 13,000. Well the Pacers want to outdo them with blue and gold knitted stocking caps, not just for volunteers, but players, coaches and even NBA commissioner Adam Silver to wear at the 2021 game. With very few rules, everyone can knit or crochet a nice “beanie” and join in the fun.

Team logos, athletic brand logos, or player specific designs are not allowed, but you can include generic basketballs and or Indianapolis. The circumference should be 22” to 24”. The yarn should only be Navy Blue (PMS 282) and Gold (PMS 123), but can be configured as you wish.
