#### QGI 2019 Block of the Month (October)

The blocks from February to December 2019 will be combined to create a quilt top without borders measuring 52.5" x 60". I plan to use multiple fabrics across two main colors (A and B) as well as neutrals (N). I do not plan to use directional prints.

#### October Block (12.5" x 12.5" finished; 13" x 13" unfinished)

cut 4: 3" squares Color A:

cut 4: 3 3/8" squares, cut each once diagonally

Color B: cut 4: 3 3/8" squares, cut each once diagonally

Neutrals (N): cut 1: 3" square

cut 4: 3 3/8" squares, cut each once diagonally

cut 4: 3" x 5 1/2" rectangles





Before sewing, lay out all cut pieces to match block layout shown. Sew all seams with a scant 1/4" inch seam allowance.

1. Sew the long side of 4 N triangles to the long side of 4 A triangles to form

4 (N/A) 3" squares. Press seam toward fabric A.

2. Sew the long side of 4 B triangles to the long side of 4 A triangles to form 4 (B/A) 3" squares. Press seam toward fabric A.

3. Sew the long side of 4 N triangles to the long side of 4 B triangles to form 4 (N/B) 3" squares. Press seam toward fabric B.

4. Sew the 4 (N/B) squares to the 4 (B/A) squares joining the B sides of each unit to form (N/B-B/A) 3" x 5 1/2" rectangles. Press seam toward (B/A) square.

5. Sew the 4 (N/A) squares to the 4 3" A squares to form (N/A-A) 3"  $\times$  5 1/2" rectangles. Ensure correct orientation. Press seam toward the A square.

6. Sew the four (N/B-B/A) rectangles from step 4 to the four N rectangles to form 4 squares that measure 5 1/2" x 5 1/2". Press seam toward fabric N. This unit is called SQ6 in remaining steps.

7. Sew the short A side of 2 (N/A-A) units from step 5 to opposite sides of the 3" N square. Ensure correct orientation. Press seams toward fabric A. This unit forms the middle row of the block and should measure 3" x 13".

8. Lay out 2 SQ6 units and one (N/A-A) unit from step 5 for top row of block. Repeat for the bottom row. Ensure orientation of units matches final block. Sew a SQ6 unit to each of the long sides of two (N/A-A) units to make 2 (SQ6-N/A-A-SQ6) units that each measure 13" x 5 1/2". Press seams toward the middle (N/A-A) unit.



9. Sew the 2 units from step 8 to the top and bottom of the unit from step 7. Press seams toward the outside of the block. Completed block should measure 13" by 13" unfinished.

Judy introduced QGI member Jan Broemel who is a modern/art quilter, teaches and operates Twelve Red Chairs retreat center. She spoke about how reading helps her become more creative and shared several books she has used for inspiration. She also shared some of her creations as shown below.

Judy Barmann told about the migrant quilt exhibit which she saw at the Interchurch Building at 42<sup>nd</sup> and Michigan Road. It is there until September 26 and is open Monday through Friday.

Margaret Duke reported that 94 quilts, 49 pillowcases, 46 pet beds and 42 premie quilts were distributed during the last two months.

Mary Ellen Straughn talked about the guild's new website.

Shari Harrison, guild president, presented the proposed changes to the guild by-laws which will be voted on in three separate votes at the September general meeting.

Shari also reported that over 300 quilts have been registered for the quilt show.

Mary Strinka encouraged all to visit the quilt show being held in Pendleton.

Mary also shared that we sold \$1630 worth of opportunity quiltstickets and seven patterns at the State Fair in August. Mary Strinka thanked Chris Robertson for her work in organizing this event.

Items have been sorted for the Peony Shop and raffle baskets.

Barbara Triscari reported that 50% of the volunteer shifts for the show have been filled.

Melissa Snyder showed the 11 blocks of the month that were turned in by seven members. Betsy LaBell won the blocks. The November block will have a Christmas theme.

Hospitality Report: There were 91 members and three guests present. \$104.98 was collected for the church.

Door Prizes: Maureen Weflen distributed five door prizes.

Show and Tell: Eleven quilts and other items were shown.

Analogous: 3 colors sharing a common color

Expanded all colors between 2 primaries

Triad: 3-color scheme evenly spaced around the color wheel

Choose one hue as lead, and two supporting colors

#### **QUILT SHOW UPDATE**

As I write this update, the quilt show is less than 3 weeks away. When you read it, it will be even closer.

We still have some volunteer shifts available. Remember, we are not doing a 2-day admission this year, so if you plan to come to the show both days and want to get in free, you need to be signed up for two volunteer shifts. Get another one now while you can. Go to <a href="https://www.signupgenius.com/go/8050e4daaa722a5ff2-qgi2019">https://www.signupgenius.com/go/8050e4daaa722a5ff2-qgi2019</a>. If you have a friend or family member who wants to volunteer and get free admission too, go ahead and sign them up. All we ask is that non-guild-members who want to volunteer are people who are known to someone in the guild.

All volunteers will get a green parking tag for their car. This tag allows you to come and go from the fairgrounds as many times as you need between Wed, Oct 9 and Sat, Oct 12. So if you'd like to do lunch outside the fairgrounds, you can leave and come back. Also, if you have a green tag, you can bring as many people in your car as it will hold. Anyone who does not have a green tag will need to pay the fairgrounds parking fee (\$8.00) each time they enter. Volunteers will also have access to a small refrigerator in the volunteer room, if you want to bring your own snacks. (But keep in mind it's a small fridge!) Volunteers on Wednesday and Thursday can bring anything, since the concession stand will not be open.

A note about eating at the show: The official policy of the state fairgrounds is that no outside food or drink is allowed inside the building. (Our volunteer workers are exempt). However, if you have any special dietary needs that cannot be met by the fairgrounds concessionaire, you can bring your own food and keep it in your car, or bring in what you need for emergency needs. All we ask is that you exercise reasonable discretion, and don't carry in outside food that is clearly marked from an outside commercial source. We do expect to have reasonably healthy options available for you at the concession stands (Sorry, no deep-fried Oreos!)

There will be two entry gates open at the fairgrounds: Gate 1 (on 38<sup>th</sup> st) is closest to the Ag/Hort Building. If you come in Gate 6 (on Fall Creek Parkway), just go straight ahead, past the grandstand and the coliseum, and you'll eventually come to the Ag/Hort Building on your right. There are 15 handicapped parking spaces immediately next to the building (and more just a few steps away). The rest of the area around and behind the building is all surface parking, so no one should need to be far away. Please don't use a handicapped space if you don't have a proper tag; the fairgrounds security force does monitor the parking areas.

Thank you to everyone who has entered their quilts, and those who have helped us get here. Please join us and bring all your friends. Hope to see all your happy faces and your beautiful quilts.
